*From the President*

**Happy New Year, Everyone!**

Now that the election of three board members is complete, this is a good time to explain how the Tri Palm HOA Board election process works.

Our HOA Board has nine members. Each person serves a three-year term, and we elect three board members each year. Those seats can be filled by new candidates or by current board members who decide to run again.

After the election, the board holds its regular January meeting, which takes place before the winter homeowners' meeting. At this January meeting, the first step is to officially swear in the newly elected board members.

Next, the board nominates and votes for a new president. Once chosen, the new president takes over leadership. The previous president either steps down or, if reelected, hands over responsibilities to the new president.

The board then elects the other officers: Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary. These four officers make up the Executive Committee. After that, the president appoints the remaining five directors to lead specific committees. This is like how a U.S. President appoints cabinet members, but without Senate approval.

This year's election resulted in the following board positions: Fred Knutzen, president; Kim Ward, vice-president; Carol Norwood, treasurer; and Maureen Steinwall, secretary.

Ward, chair, co-Chair, Carol Norwood; Architectural: Andy McNab, chair, Brad Chudiak, co-chair; Legal: Brad Chudiak, chair, co-chair, Fred Knutzen; RR&F: Laurie Hirth, chair, co-chair, Karla Beairsto; Community Relations, Laurie Hirth, chair, co-chair, Carol Norwood; Communications/Happenings: Maureen Steinwall, chair, Andy McNab, co-chair.

All incumbents were reelected this year. This is my second year serving on this board, and in my opinion, our team works very well together. We manage a wide range of issues across our committees on a daily basis, and in future issues of *Happenings*, our team will explain each committee's role and responsibilities in greater detail.

and photos) should go to happenings@tpuoa.com. About half of this year's invoices were sent by email, and 46 homeowners paid almost immediately using the online link. While we'd love to reach full electronic delivery, we know not everyone uses email, so mailed invoices will continue. A realistic goal for 2027 might be 80% electronic. Each electronic invoice saves the association \$3, which adds up over time.

This year's senior audit form includes a question asking whether you want to receive electronic communications. If you check the opt-in box, next year's invoice will arrive by email. 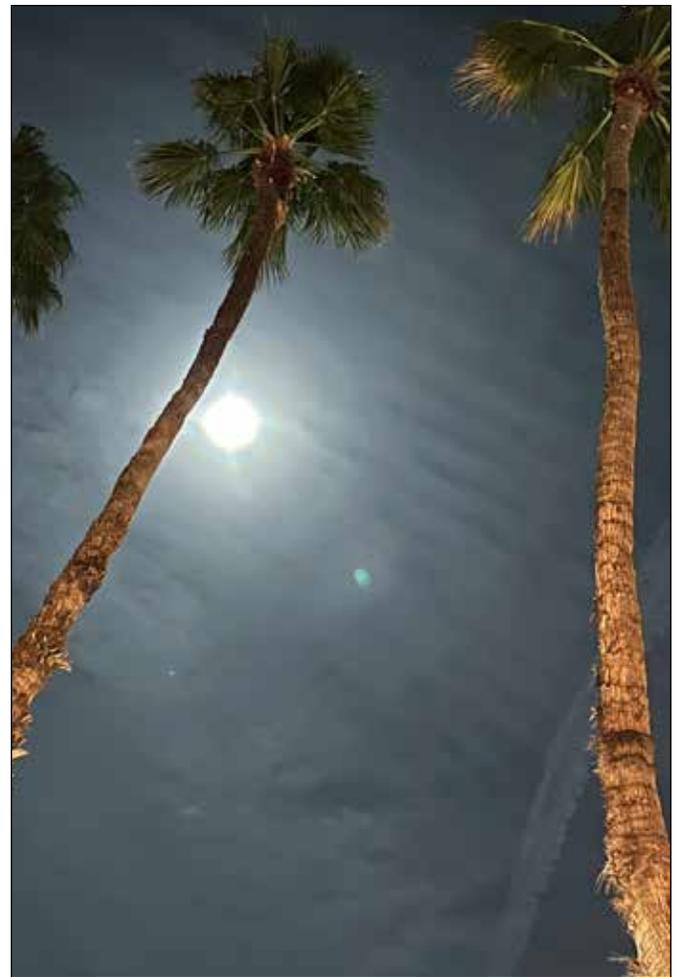
Our new players are part of the District Rookie Tournament to be held later January.

# What's free and has so many health benefits?

Whether you're physically active or sedentary, water is crucial for our bodies and essential to good health. Every cell depends on it to function properly. need water to stay flexible, lubricated, strong and to move smoothly. Without enough water, skin, muscles, and connective tissues become stiff, prone to strain or injury and are slower to heal. Interesting fact: dehydration forces the body to pull water from joints, as well as other areas, allowing toxins to accumulate and cause inflammation! Hydration doesn't just benefit the body but it's also critical for mental clarity. Even mild dehydration can impair

your focus, reaction times, stamina, decision-making and cause you to feel tired.

It's recommended to start rehydrating your body as soon as you get up in the morning by drinking a glass of water. Aim for consistent intake throughout the day, not just when thirsty. Carry a reusable water bottle and drink before, during, and after physical activity or time outside in the heat. 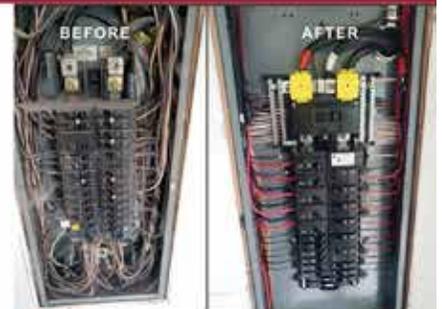
